Executive Summary

Objectives:

- 1. To fully fund operations for claims services and emergency financial assistance through June 30, 2026.
- 2. To maintain a cadre of at least 8 fully qualified Chapter Service officers to provide claims services to Veterans, their families, and their survivors.
- 3. To represent the Chapter each year at Department Convention, Department Midterm Conference, National Convention, and National Mid-Winter Conference.
- 4. To refinish or replace Chapter building flooring by the end of FY 2023.
- 5. To replace the Chapter front door with an ADA-friendly entry by the end of FY 2023.
- 6. To erect a Gold Star Mothers memorial by the end of FY 2024.
- 7. To provide a Chapter item (x3,000) for National Convention in Phoenix in August 2024 (FY 2025).
- 8. To build the Payson satellite office into a new Chapter by the end of FY 2026.

The Chapter prides itself on being the premier organization for providing VA claims services to Veterans, their families, and their survivors. The Chapter has the highest number of Level II Chapter Service Officers and facilitates more VA claims than any other DAV Chapter in Arizona.

About Us

We are dedicated to a single purpose: empowering veterans to lead high-quality lives with respect and dignity. We accomplish this by ensuring that veterans and their families can access the full range of benefits available to them; fighting for the interests of America's injured heroes on Capitol Hill; and educating the public about the great sacrifices and needs of veterans transitioning back to civilian life.

Services

Many Veterans are not aware that they can be compensated for service-connected problems that they may have may result in them receiving compensation. Our highly trained Chapter Service Officers (CSOs) can help you with your service-connected claims with the VA. They can advise you on what service-connected conditions you may qualify for, how to get the necessary evidence, navigate the complicated VA system for compensation claims, and help fill out the necessary claims forms for you.

Trained and certified Chapter Service Officers prepare and file Veterans' applications for service-connected disabilities or pensions, including (but not limited to):

- Aid and attendance for severely ill or disabled. The attendant may be your spouse or another person.
- Pensions for Veterans whose income falls below specified levels.
- Filing for enrollment in the VA Health Care System.
- Filing for additional compensation for dependents, including parents, spouse, and children.
- Application for burial benefits.
- Application for compensation, surviving spouse pension, Dependency Indemnity Compensation (DIC), and accrued benefits.
- Veterans' application for Individual Unemployability.

Target Market

The Chapter focuses on Central Arizona's East Valley. This is defined as the 101 Loop eastern loop eastward to 30 miles east of Globe, AZ, and from Chandler north to Fountain Hills. Fundraising, in terms of grants, will target corporations with local presence that may also have locations outside the Phoenix metropolitan area.

This is accomplished by operations from Monday through Friday from 0900 to 1400 and the third Saturday of the month from 0900-1200. Trained and qualified Chapter Service Officers review and compile claims for VA disability compensation during those hours.

The primary operations of the Arizona East Valley Veterans Foundation are centered on emergency financial assistance to Veterans for rent, utility payments, and transportation (fuel cards). Such requests are screened and approved by the Commander or Adjutant of DAV East Valley Chapter 8, acting as President and Secretary of the Foundation, respectively.
